CHAPTER I

GENERAL FUNCTIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE

1.34 Economy in Expenditure during the year 1989-90.

It is to say that in view of the continuing constraint or financial resources, it is considered necessary that utmost economy should be observed in the State Expenditure. The Government has, therefore, decided that the measures adopted during in year 1988-89 should be continued with effect from the 1st April, 1989 for effecting economy in expenditure during the year 1989-90, as follows:--

A. 10% Economy cut on the non-Plan Expenditure :

3-20 To achieve the afore-mentioned objective, it has been decided to impose a minimum cut of 10% on the non-committed portion of the non-Plan expenditure during the year 1989-90. Accordingly, the non-Plan expenditure to be incurred by the various Departments (excluding the liabilities on account of interest payments, pensionary benefits, salary, stipends, maintenance expenditure and Commercial Wing of the Punjab Roadways) should be reduced by ten per cent as per Appendix. The expenditure during the period from the list April, 1989 to the 30th September, 1989 is not to exceed fifty per cent of the amount shown in column 8 (except in the case of the entry at Serial No. 50 of the Statement).

B. Ban on creation of this :

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During the year 1988-89 a complete ban on the creation of the new posts (including upgradation of posts) on Plan and non-Plan sides was imposed, --vide letter No. 5/6/88-5FBI/3391 dated the 30th March, 1988. It has been decided that--

- (i) the complete ban placed during the year 1988-89 or the creation of new posts including upgradation of posts on Plan and non-Plan sides, except in exceptiona circumstances, shall continue during the year 1989-9 as well; and
- (ii) an exercise should be undertaken to locate surplu staff in different Departments and divert them to th areas where they are required for the execution o the Plan Programmes 1989-90.

C. Restriction on the use of telephones :

It has been decided that the Subscribers Trunk Diallin facility at office and residence should be restricted to the Adminis Re trative Secretaries, the Joint Secretaries and the Heads of Depart be ments as heretofore. In case of couples in service, where bot an husband and wife are entitled to telephones at residence, only the one telephone should be allowed. However, their entitlement for me local calls remain intact.

D. Tours outside the States :

(i) Staff cars are not to be taken outside the State. They o may be used for going on tour to Delhi/Shimla only by the t Administrative Secretaries, the Joint Secretaries to the Government y and the Heads of Departments.

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(ii) In case it is essential for an officer below the rank r of Joint Secretary/Head of Department to go on tour to Delhi, e he should use the mode of travel to which he is entitled. He would, however, be reimbursed taxi charges from the Bus Stand/ Railway Station/Airport to the Punjab Bhawan and back and also for attending official meetings. However, Secretaries of the Administrative Departments may give relaxation in case of officers who are not at present permitted to use staff cars for travel to Delhi.

(iii) It has been observed that the various Departments of the Government do not adequately use the office of the Resident Commissioner at Delhi for sorting out problems with the Government of India. In future, it should be ensured that the Resident Commissioner of the Deputy Secretary in his office is associated with the important meetings in the Government of India and follow-up action after the meetings should generally be left to the office of the Resident Commissioner. This would obviate the necessity of officers of the State Government going on tour to Delhi for followup action or for sorting out routine matters.

E. Ban on purchase of Motor Vehicles by the Departments of the Government :

The complete ban on the purchase of motor vehicles by all the Departments of the State Government except those required for the use of the State Police Force imposed, --vide Circular letter No. 6/1/84-B&C(I)/4444, dated the 23rd May, 1984, shall continue in the year 1989-90. This ban will not, however, apply to the vehicles required for the use of the Governor, the Advisor, the Chief Secretary, the Financial Commissioners, the Administrative Secretaries to the Government, the Commissioners of Divisions, the Deputy Commissioners and the Sub-Divisional Magistrates.

(ii) The expenditure on travelling should be cut to required extent by laying down norms of touring by var functionaries in the Department and ensuring that no liabs by of pending Travelling Allowance Bills in respect of journeys du the year is allowed to accumulate for payment during the year.

(iii) A time bound action programme may be drawn rank reviewing all programmes and activities with a view to priorities ethic, expenditure, so that expenditure on in essential and low prior.
He items are reduced or eliminated. There should be no reluct to give up a scheme or activity in case it is established to also wasted and incapable of being effectively administered or mana inis- It may be ensured that the existing personnel, who become sur who as a result thereof are deployed on new activities and scheme instead making recruitment of staff for new activities and scheme.

(iv) The expenditure on dinners, lunches and recept should be frugal. The Public Undertakings and other bodies sh not be required to meet expenditure on such entertainments.

(v) Prior concurrence of the Department of Personnel Administrative Reforms may be obtained in respect of each Trai Programme before officers are deputed to undergo it.

(vi) There should be no purchase of new fixtures/furnish solely because of a change in incumbent of the office.

(vii) Very restricted expenditure should be incurred the Government funds on printing and distribution of calend diaries, greeting cards, personal letter heads and other expen items in connection with the new year and other festivals.

2. It is requested that necessary steps may be t immediately to ensure that the instructions contained in the prece paragraphs are implemented strictly.
